2023 SOLO STRING FESTIVAL & SPRING SALON FUNDRAISER

This year, we hold our annual Solo String Festival and Spring Salon Fundraiser in person at **Benaroya Hall, May 05-07, 2023.**

Middle and high school violin and viola students will perform for judges and compete for a chance to win prizes. The Solo String Festival will conclude with an inspiring 60-minute fundraising program to raise scholarship funds to support students' continued music lessons throughout the year. ABOUT

Dr. Quinton Morris is the Executive Director and Founder of Key to Change, host of the radio show Unmute the Voices on Classical King FM, and Associate Professor of Violin at Seattle University.

Dr. Morris stands as a role model of Black excellence and mastery within a traditionally white discipline.

As a mentor and an inspiration to many, Dr. Morris sees his work with young musicians and his collaboration with community leaders as a key to change for the greater good. Dr. Morris is the second living Black violinist in United States history to receive tenure and promotion at the university level. He grew up in a single-parent household in South King County and understands the obstacles that students of color face in the region with accessing high-quality music education.

To address the disparities in access, Dr. Morris founded Key to Change in 2017 to provide underserved youth and students of color living in South King County with world-class violin and viola instruction at an affordable rate.



At Key to Change, we believe it is essential that the youth we serve can see themselves reflected in our leadership team. Our founder, Dr. Quinton Morris is a Black violinist who grew up in a single-parent household in South King County. He is a graduate of Renton High School, which many of our students currently attend.

Dr. Morris has a lived experience of the obstacles that many students of color continue to face in the region. Similarly, our staff and board reflect the faces and experience of our student body -60% of our staff and 75% of our board of directors identify as people of color and 90% of them are women.

OUR MISSION

Key to Change inspires underserved youth through world-class music instruction and supports their development as self-aware leaders.

Founded and directed by Dr. Quinton Morris, Key to Change offers a proven pathway to educational excellence for public school students through rigorous, personalized programming. When we succeed, racially and economically diverse students in South King County and beyond have access to world-class music education, mentorship and leadership skills that propel them to lifetime success. Public school students in underserved communities, rarely, if ever, receive adequate funding and support for musical training. Music programs are among the first to be discontinued and the few that remain are on life support despite the hard work of underresourced or unqualified music teachers.

Music programs that are artistically rigorous, diverse, and inclusive for students from underserved communities in the Pacific Northwest are almost nonexistent.

6 YEARS OF GROWTH IN DIVERSITY AND EQUITY

Since the inception of Key to Change, hundreds of students have had an opportunity to take music lessons, participate in numerous musical outreach activities, and learn in a diverse and inclusive environment that supports their true potential. In 2020, the global pandemic brought a new challenge to accessibility, and an unanticipated opportunity. In response, Dr. Morris led a successful pivot from in-person to online lessons. The number of students enrolled in the string studio quadrupled over the pandemic and we have retained over 90% of our students enrolled in the program.

While Dr. Morris is loved by his students and their families and respected by his colleagues, that has not been enough. What makes Dr. Morris a hero in South King County isn't only his musical and academic accolades, of which there are many. Rather, it is what Dr. Morris has chosen to do with the authority and prestige his professional accomplishment affords him. He has advocated for students of color and their families for years with the same passion, rigor, and joy he brings to his own artistry. The change he is making allows students of color to have access to the highest level of educational opportunities, which is what they deserve.

Many other leaders of change have joined him and provide direct support for his students through Key to Change programs. Dr. Morris's students gain courage and confidence as they master the challenge of their instruments and connect to cultures and ways of being outside of their norms.

Students grow as people with qualities of character we hope the next generation of leadership will embody. Key to Change is a world-changer at home in South King County, fostering a legacy of excellence for generations to come.

THE OPPORTUNITY BEFORE US

Many students express interest in musical training, but their aspirations are short lived. The lack of accessible opportunity in public schools, strong pedagogy to help students step up to the rigor and commitment to train, and a nurturing community are insurmountable obstacles for students and their families. The pursuit of classical music presents an additional obstacle as a traditionally white cultural asset. Music programs that are artistically rigorous, diverse, accessible, and relatable for students from underserved communities are very few in the Pacific Northwest. The need and potential among our youth are far greater than our current ability to serve them.

South King County is one of the most ethnically diverse neighborhoods in the region with high poverty-levels among families, predictably poor health and wellness outcomes for residents, and appallingly deprived educational resources. Nonetheless, South King County neighborhoods are culturally rich, vibrant, and growing. Community leaders are engaged and determined to secure opportunities for residents. South King County is a place of great need and great potential. It's a great place for dynamic change.

It's a great place for Key to Change.

DIRECT IMPACT IS THE KEY TO CHANGE

Research consistently demonstrates that students who participate in music education have higher academic achievement, greater intellectual and creative growth, and improved social competence.

Music education sets young people up for success in life. Public school music programs struggle throughout the region for barely-adequate resources, and racially and economically diverse students have almost no access to music education. Located in and committed to South King County, Key to Change is perfectly positioned to serve one of the region's most diverse public school populations with more than 32,000 high school and 21,000 middle school students.

The need is there. We know the desire to learn the violin or viola is also there. Our student enrollment has grown each year and it grew exponentially over the course of the pandemic when online access opened the opportunity to even more students.



OUR VISION

Our young people cannot wait. Their critical learning years are right now. We cannot be stopped by the failures of the public school system or the obstacles and inequities present in underserved neighborhoods.

Key to Change is activated and growing. Our vision is to enroll and support every student in South King County who comes to us to learn violin or viola. We desire to help every student thrive and excel.

THE ROAD AHEAD

We will continue to build partnerships with school districts and community organizations to direct students to our program and scale up to accommodate growing enrollment. Our commitment to world-class musical training and performance will be unwavering.

We will grow our network of supporters, donors, sponsors, and champions who are foundational to the financial stability of Key to Change and stakeholders in all we accomplish. Key to Change is a center of excellence in an unlikely place. The youth of South King County deserve nothing less.

As we continue to scale and grow, we're confident that we will be able to build a holistic learning environment where students can flourish.

Students participate in masterclasses with professional musicians from the Seattle Symphony, and violin or viola professors from renowned music schools and universities. Key to Change presents a minimum of six guest artist masterclasses each year. These classes allow them to receive specialized, individual training and mentorship that accelerates their studies.

Our annual Solo String Festival is a yearly community event for middle and high school violin and viola students who live, attend school, and study their instrument in South King County. Students compete for prizes for renowned musicians who serve as judges, participate in workshops and clinics on musicianship and technique, and work in teams to perform and learn music.
